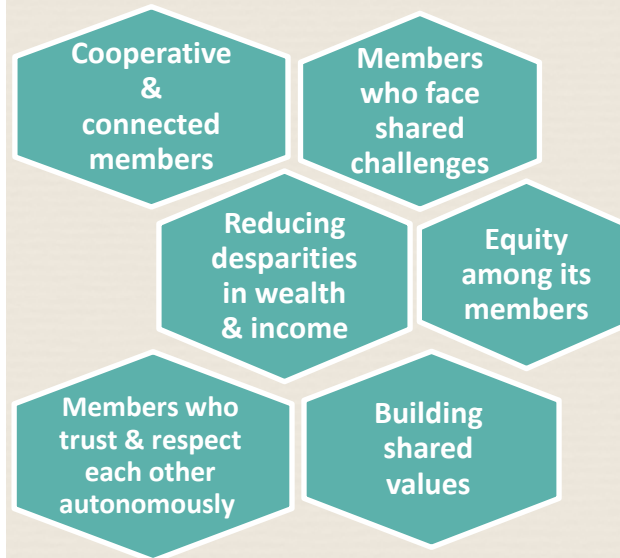


"Social cohesion is a measure of a society's members' willingness to cooperate and their autonomous action in support of social norms that already exist within a society."



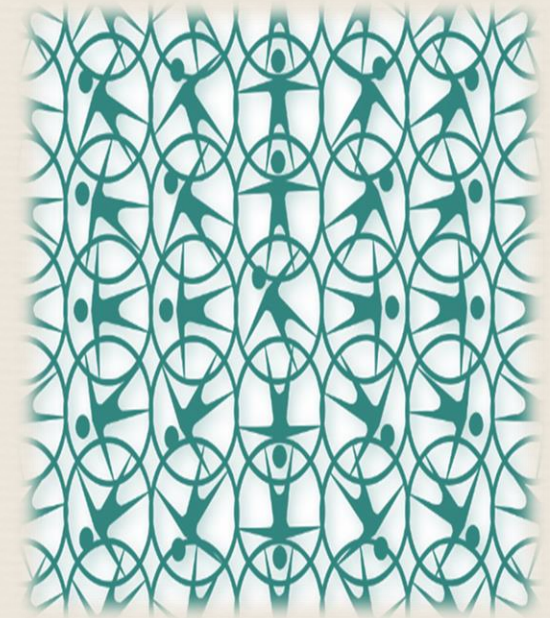

THE FOUR TYPES OF ORGANIZATIONS

Social cohesion is influenced by the various sectors of a society. Each sector can have a positive or a negative effect on social cohesion.
